About our Veteran



Santiago Elk Grove

Santiago is a 74-year old Veteran who served active duty in Vietnam and is in great need of help.

Santiago grew up in Sacramento and enlisted in the Army in 1964. He served in Vietnam as a short jumper. After finishing his service, Santiago returned home to Sacramento where he began working as a mechanic at McClellan Air Force Base.

He worked at McClellan for over twenty years then worked at the local Campbell's Soup factory for 23 years before retiring in February of 2007. Santiago and his wife bought their home in Elk Grove in 1978 and raised their two children there.

When Santiago's wife left and he went from a two-income household to a single-income household, he could no longer afford the needed repairs in his home. While he was able to have a new roof put on roughly fifteen years ago, the roof was poorly installed and proved to be an in-effective moisture barrier. For the past few years, water has been leaking through the roof and causing mold growth and damage to the drywall in the ceiling.

Santiago also suffers from very severe diabetes (caused from orange exposure during his time in the war) and will be losing his legs soon.



About the Project



Repairs Needed

Mold remediation – including removal of all drywall and insulation from ceiling Complete roof replacement

Replacement of non-operable heating and air unit

Update bathrooms with accessibility features – including roll in showers and grab bars Replace and resurface bathroom countertops, sinks, and cabinets where damaged

Replace flooring throughout the house

Replace kitchen countertops and cabinet doors.

Repair and paint damaged drywall throughout the house

Replace damaged interior doors

Repair stucco and repaint exterior of house

Install gutters and downspouts where missing

Minor plumbing repairs

Repair and replacement of miscellaneous electrical fixtures throughout the house



Project Costs



Cost:

The projected cost of the entire project including materials, building permits, and the cost of subcontractors is \$42,545 with an additional \$10,000 needed for mold remediation and supervisor labor. The homeowner will pay back 25 percent of the project cost or \$10,636 through a zero interest loan from Habitat. Payments made on the loan will go back into the "Fund for Humanity" to build or repair homes for other low income individuals and families.
